Position Overview

Reporting to The CMM Director of Health & Social Services, The ADI Diabetes Community Consultant will manage and administer the ADI program activities in the eight member communities by supporting workplan development, work collaboratively with community health staff to support community-based diabetes initiatives, and complete annual ADI reports.

- Provide community-based diabetes and nutrition education sessions to people across the lifespan
- Provide individual and group diabetes and nutrition counseling
